GSA Recognizes Green Globes for Federal Leases THEGBI.ORG

The U.S. General Services Administration (GSA) has recently recognized GBI's Green Globes certification as an allowable certification program for use in the GSA's federal leasing activities. This decision comes after the GSA's Office of Leasing completed a months-long review and update of its leasing documents. The revisions to GSA's Request for Lease Proposals (RLP) and Lease templates now recognize Green Globes for New Construction (Green Globes NC) as an option for new construction leased spaces where green building certification is required for any building over 10,000 square feet, as well as Green Globes for Sustainable Interiors (Green Globes SI), which can be used as an option for tenant improvements.
