The big news this month is that the newest edition of the *International Green Construction Code* (IgCC) has been published. The 2015 IgCC is the last edition to have the technical content developed through the traditional ICC code process. Going forward, ASHRAE 189.1, *Standard for the Design of High-Performance Green Buildings Except Low-Rise Residential Buildings*, will form the technical content of the IgCC. (Currently Standard 189.1 is an alternative compliance path in the IgCC.) Interest and attendance at the recent ASHRAE meetings in Atlanta were high due to this change. The 2015 IgCC contains several changes of interest. Check it out yourself here.
